

What does CESQG mean?

CESQG is the acronym meaning Conditionally Exempt Small Quantity Generator. These are businesses that produce small amounts of hazardous waste that can be handled through SCISWA's satellite drop-off program.

What qualifies as a hazardous waste?

Any solid, liquid or contained gas known to be harmful to human health and the environment.

Four characteristics help identify hazardous wastes:

Ignitable — it catches fire under certain conditions

Corrosive — it corrodes metals or has a very high or low pH

Reactive — it is unstable and explodes or produces toxic fumes, gases or vapors

Toxic — it is harmful or fatal when ingested or absorbed or it leaches harmful chemicals into the soil or groundwater when disposed on land

Could your business use the CESQG program?

Does it meet these requirements?

- It produces less than 220 pounds of hazardous waste per month
- It doesn't store more than 2,200 pounds of hazardous waste on-site at one time
- It uses and stores less than 2.2 pounds of acutely hazardous waste at any time
